	The Impact of Bullying: A Personal View	As the author states, "Bullying Hurts." You may not realize it now, but bullying can negatively affect everyone involved: the bully, the victim and the bystanders. Do you want to be known as the mean kid that hurt others?
	<u>11-year-old's suicide</u> attempt part of epidemic	Bullying is more than actions and words. It can create painful emotions that may cause the victim to think irrationally and consider suicide the only way to make it stop. What if your friend hurt so bad, you never saw them again?
Gangs	<u>Gang member at 12,</u> <u>student turns his life</u> around	Gang members may seem like family now, but your life and your future are not what are important to them. Do you really want to risk your future?
	Death and All His Friends Cast Long Shadows	Being in a gang not only puts your life at risk, but the lives of those around you as well. How would you feel if your mother, brother or sister was killed because of the gang you were in?
	Gang Member Gets Life Sentence	If you commit a crime to join a gang, you will be the one held responsible for that crime. You will be the one that goes to jail, even if it wasn't your idea. Depending on the crime, you could be sentenced to LIFE in prison. Is your whole life worth risking, just by joining a gang?
Social Media	<u>14-Year-Old Girl</u> <u>Kidnapped for Prostitution</u> <u>Ring by Man She Met on</u> <u>Facebook</u>	People can say whatever they want on the internet and it's up to you to know what the truth is. Never trust someone you don't really know and never share information that they could use to nd you. What do you think would have happened to this girl if the police had not found her?
and Internet Safety	<u>I was Blackmailed with</u> <u>Naked Pictures at age 16</u>	Once images are shared over the Internet they cannot be erased. It will stay there forever, and may resurface when you are an adult with kids of your own. Would you want your kids seeing an inappropriate picture of you as a kid?
	<u>I Survived an Internet</u> <u>Predator</u>	Since this happened, the internet has become even more powerful and much more dangerous. One of the biggest dangers are online predators: those who seek out children and teenagers to take advantage of their innocence. Meeting people in real-life should be left to adults. Is your life worth risking to meet a make-believe friend?
Sexting	Teen 'sexting' case goes to trial	Sending out pictures and videos of you and your friends may seem exhilarating at the time but sharing inappropriate sexual content, often called "sexting," is illegal and you can be prosecuted in a court of law. If the content includes anyone under the age of 18, it is considered child pornography, and you can be charged as a sex offender, a label that will ruin your future. Suicide Prevention	<u>Teen suicide: Hidden pain</u> leads to tragic action	Suicide is a permanent solution to a temporary problem. "Stopping" the pain by suicide, will create a lot more pain for those around you. No matter what you may think, your family would be devastated if you were gone, even if you have done something that would upset them. Try asking them about it if you don't believe it? They may be afraid to get help, and may even ask you not to tell anyone, but reporting your concerns will get them the help they need before it's too late.
